ORDER

WHEREAS, the **Prakash Institute of Ayurvedic Medical Sciences and Research, Jhajhar, Bulendshehar, Uttar Pradesh** was granted conditional permission under section 13C/13A of the IMCC Act, 1970 to take admission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic year 2018-19 vide Ministry's letter no. R.12011/48/2015-EP (IM-1) for 2018-19 dated 24.09.2018.

- 2. WHEREAS, a copy of the above mentioned order dated 24.09.2018 was also sent to the Secretary, Central Council of Indian Medicine (CCIM), New Delhi for information and necessary action with the remarks that the resumption of admissions for the academic year 2019-20 may be considered by the Central Government on the basis of a recommendations of the CCIM based on an inspection to verify the Compliance submitted by the College in terms of the provisions under the IMCC Act and the relevant regulations;
- 3. WHEREAS, the CCIM had *suomoto* visited the college on 08-09.03.2019 to reassess the available facilities of teaching and practical training as well as to verify the compliance report submitted by the college and furnished its report and recommendations to the Central Government vide letter Ref.No.3-4/2019-Ay.(49) dated 22.04.2019. The CCIM had forwarded the visitation report to the Ministry of AYUSH and recommended for not granting permission for admission in UG (BAMS) course for the session 2019-20 under section 13A/13C of the IMCC Act, 1970 with following shortcomings:-

1. Area of the Common Departments:-

- i. There are four lecture halls available against the minimum requirement of five lecture halls.
- 2. There is non-availability of Computers and Printers in all 14 teaching departments.
- 3. AGBAS Bio-Metric attendance system is not available.

4. Teaching Staff:-

- i. There is only 01 higher faculty available in the department of Kayachikitsa against the minimum requirement of 02.
- ii. Dr. Deepika Tyagi (AYUSV0384) has been considered as Associate Professor as per designation mentioned in the affidavit as Associate Professor, Swasthavritta and Appointment and Joining of teacher as Associate Professor, Swasthavritta is also enclosed with the visitation report as well as She joined as Associate Professor in the College as

per record available in Online teacher management system. Therefore may be considered as Higher faculty in Swasthavritta. However visitors consider her as lecturer.

5. Functionality of the Hospital:-

- i. The average attendance of OPD per day from 1st Jan 2018 to 31st Dec 2018 is 89.25 against the minimum requirement of 120 per day.
- 4. WHEREAS, the recommendations and visitation report of the CCIM have been carefully examined in terms of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016, provisions under the IMCC Act, 1970, relevant regulations made thereunder and as per approved Standard Operative Procedures (SOPs) and policies issued from time to time for issuing Permission for this purpose;
- 5. WHEREAS, on examining the case in light of above notified & approved criteria and on perusal of visitation report, it was observed that the college was not fulfilling the basic eligibility condition and the following deficiencies were found:
 - i. There is only **01 higher faculty** available in the department of Kayachikitsa against the minimum requirement of **02** as per RMS,2016.
 - ii. **89.25** patients per day, are reported in OPD during the assessment period (i.e. 01.01.2018 31.12.2018) in eight OPD departments against the requirement of **120** as per RMS,2016.
 - iii. There is **04 Lecture hall** available against the requirement of **05 Lecture hall** as per RMS,2016.
 - iv. Functional Clinical Laboratory is not available as per RMS,2016.
 - v. Biometric attendance is not available as per RMS,2016.
 - vi. College website URL: <u>www.prakashayurvedicinstitute.in</u> is available but the required information is **not uploaded** as per regulation 9(2) of RMS, 2016.
 - vii. There is **non-availability** of Computers and Printers in all 14 teaching departments as per RMS,2016.
- 6. WHEREAS, considering the deficiencies observed therein as mentioned in para 5 above, the college was given an opportunity of hearing vide Hearing Notice No.L-14014/14/2019-EP(1) dated 26.04.2019 in terms of the first proviso to sub-section (5) of Section 13A of the IMCC Act, 1970 to appear on 03.05.2019 at 10:30 AM before the designated Hearing Committee in the Ministry of AYUSH to present their case and to show cause as to why the permission to take admissions to UG (BAMS) course under section 13C/13A of the IMCC Act for the year 2019-20 should not be denied to the college. The college was instructed to make oral as well as written submissions in respect of the case. The college was represented by Dr.Jyotsna, Vice principal and Dr. Anoop M, Assistant Professor, of the aforesaid college. The representatives of the college submitted oral as well as written submissions against the deficiencies conveyed to them vide the Ministry's letter dated 26.04.2019.
- 7. WHEREAS, in view of the observation of the Hearing Committee based on submission made by the college representatives during hearing and the recommendations and visitation report of the CCIM referred in para 3 above, it is found that, **Prakash Institute of Ayurvedic Medical Sciences and Research**, **Jhajhar**, **Bulendshehar**, **Uttar Pradesh** is not fulfilling the following basic minimum requirements for grant of permission for the academic session 2019-20:

- i. College is **not having** required number of OPD attendance per day against the minimmum requirement of 120 OPD attendance per day as per RMS, 2016. (One of the most essential parameter for the functionality of the Hospital.)
- ii. College is **not having** required number of Lecture hall against the requirement of 05 Lecture hall as per RMS,2016. (Essential to provide quality medical education to the student).
- iii. College is **not having** functional Clinical laboratory as per RMS,2016. (It is very much essential for providing proper medical care/investigations to OPD& IPD patients.)
- iv. College is not having functional Bio-metric attendance for teaching staff, non-teaching staff and hospital staff as per RMS, 2016. (Biometric attendance is important parameter to assess the regular availability of teaching faculty for conduction of regular classes for the Students and regular availability of Hospital staff for necessary Patient care through the OPD& IPD services.)
- v College is **not having** required number of computers and printers in the departments. (Necessary to perform day to day works in the teaching departments.)
- 8. WHEREAS, in view of the shortcomings and deficiencies mentioned in above paras, it is found that the said college is not fulfilling the requirements as per regulation 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for Undergraduate Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016, provision under the IMCC act, 1970, relevant regulations made there under and as per approved Standard Operative Procedures (SOPs) and other relevant regulations for granting permission for 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2019-20;
- 9. NOW, THEREFORE, in view of the shortcomings and deficiencies particularly about the non-availability of required No. of OPD attendance per day, required No. of Lecture hall, functional Clinical laboratory, functional Bio-metric attendance and required number of computers and printers as per RMS, 2016, the provisions of the IMCC Act, 1970 and the relevant regulations and is of such a serious and fundamental in nature that they adversely affect the ability of the College to provide quality medical education in terms of the provisions of the IMCC Act and the relevant regulations, it has been decided by the Central Government for denial of permission to Prakash Institute of Ayurvedic Medical Sciences and Research, Jhhjar, Bulendshehar, Uttar Pradesh for taking admission to BAMS course with 60 seats for the academic session 2019-20, under section 13A/13C of the IMCC Act, 1970.
- 10. Further, it is informed that the college is being provided a period up to 31.12.2019 to fulfill the shortcomings observed during this year as mentioned in above paras along with the following requirements, so that the CCIM may carry out inspection of the college for consideration of matter for grant of permission for taking admissions in UG (BAMS) course from the academic year 2020-21:
 - (i) All the Minimum Standards Requirements of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
 - (ii) All the Requirements of "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard of Educations in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda college);

- (iii) All the requirements under the provisions of the IMCC Act, 1970 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled *in toto*; and
- 11. This issues with the approval of the competent authority.
